- 7. McVicar/Fletcher Memorial Trust – Bursaries 2018:** The McVicar Fletcher Memorial Trust was established in 1989, following generous bequests to the Church by the late Jessie McVicar and Ian M. Fletcher. The aim of the Trust is to provide Bursaries to assist young people with the costs of their education. The Bursary is awarded for Further

or Higher Education and may cover fees for religious, academic or technical pursuits, music, art or sports activities, including travelling expenses and the purchase of special equipment. The Trustees will have the power to determine borderline cases. Persons eligible to apply for a Bursary should be not less than 16 years and not more than 19 years old on the 31st May in the year of application. Applications are open to any person within the required age range who is a member of, or has connections with, Old Gourock and Ashton Parish Church or any of its organisations and is entering Further or Higher Education for the first time or exceptionally their second year. Forms may be obtained by emailing the clerk to the trustees. Applications must be received by the clerk to the trustees by 30th June 2018. **John O. Hawthorn, Clerk to the Trustees.**
